His loyalty and love for his extended family and friends left an indelible mark on everyone who was fortunate enough to know him.

Through determination and hard work, Augie built a home at 404 Locust Street that became the heart of his family. It was more than just a house—it was the hub of togetherness, where memories were made, traditions were celebrated, love thrived, and all were welcome.

Augie's faith was the cornerstone of his life. Whether through his active involvement in Central Baptist Church of Elizabeth, NJ where he was a long-standing member, or the example he set through his words and deeds, he was a living testament to the power of faith, love, and service.
