Trevor John Innis, age 18, passed away on May 5th, 2024 in Myrtle Beach, SC.

Trevor was born on May 12, 2005 in Baltimore, MD to Jeffrey and Janice (Bindeman) Innis. He grew up in Gambrills, MD where he started playing soccer at the age of 4. He was enrolled at Anne Arundel Community College while attending high school in MD. In August 2021, Trevor and his family moved to Myrtle Beach, SC where he graduated from Saint James High School in June 2023. While attending St. James HS, Trevor earned the SC Palmetto Fellows Scholarship and numerous awards for excellence in academics. He also ran cross country and track.

Trevor completed his first year (3 semesters) of schooling at Clemson University where he majored in Computer Science while working towards a minor in Mathematics. Trevor was a member of Alpha Lambda Delta Academic Honor Society and The National Society of Collegiate Scholars. He also made the Fall 2023 President's List with a 4.0 grade point average for the semester.

Trevor loved spending time outdoors. At the age of 14, Trevor hiked approximately 125 miles in 10 days from Munich, Germany to Austria. A few years later, Trevor and his family spent 3 days white water rafting

approximately 35 miles down the Rogue River in OR where Trevor was one of only a few people his age to ever be allowed to kayak in a single person kayak through the Class IV Rapids there. Trevor had a great time exploring Scotland with his family and his cousins. He loved to zip-line and go rock climbing even though he had a fear of heights.

Trevor visited a large number of National and State Parks (Joshua Tree, Crater Lake, Redwood Forest, and Mammoth Cave to name a few) across the United States where he camped, hiked, climbed, biked and went spelunking. When asked what he thought after his visit to the Grand Canyon, Trevor responded that it was "okay". He had a better time racing an ATV across the AZ desert. Trevor wasn't too impressed with any of his tours of the White House either.

Trevor had a truly beautiful soul and to know him was to love him. He was quiet and reserved but a very special person. He will never be forgotten.

When Trevor reached the Gates of Heaven, he was greeted with open arms by his grandfather Robert L. Bindeman, his uncle Robert J. Bindeman and his cousin Bradley Innis.

Trevor is survived by his parents, Jeffrey and Janice; a younger brother, Tyler Innis; grandparents, Marcus and Sybil Innis and Joan Bindeman; aunts and uncles, David and Mary Innis, Andrew Innis, James Bindeman, Laura Bindeman, Michal and Brenda (Bindeman) Stepniak; cousins, Matthew and Katherine Stepniak; and numerous other relatives and friends.
